Pamoja and Income Generating Activities

Farming and community development through an income generating activity such as sunflower oil production means the community are contributing to food security, as there is a shortage of edible oils in Tanzanian markets and it is a product that is often still imported from abroad.

Marketing

Pamoja are opening a new point of sale for sunflower oil near to Inuka Rehabilitation Centre, at a little market at Mbeya city. They already sell the products at three farmers markets in Dar es Salaam and have gained many new customers from the local area of Wanging'ombe.

Training

With the collaboration of two agronomists employed with funds of Hakuna Matata, we are finishing the monitoring and training in the fields, with farmers.

Contribution

So Far in 2019, the below sales have generated 8.310.000 TZS (approx. €3,200) of income for the Inuka Rehabilitation Centre.

Orphanages

In 2019 so far, eight new children arrived in the Ilembula Orphanage, it is now home to 102. Of these 102, nine are HIV positive and 10 living with disabilities. In the Ilunda orphanage, there are 80 children.

The community support activity is supporting 205 families and gives support to 250 students.

The Ilembula mission is also supporting 73 nursery schools, paying the salaries of teachers, and their training and professional development. There are 3,355 children currently enrolled across these nursery schools.



Inuka Rehabilitation Center

First Quarter of 2019 in numbers:

In March 2019, Inuka received the registration to operate as a rehabilitation hospital from the Tanzanian government. The new status will be instrumental in expanding the services available to people in need and contribute to the future sustainability of the centre. The new status means Inuka will receive additional government funding. The Ministry of Health has granted the change of status on the condition that the existing infrastructure and services are upgraded to meet the national health guidelines, ensuring a wider range of services to patients with rehabilitation needs. Hakuna Matata has pledged further funds of over **€70,000** in order to help Inuka meet these guidelines.

Training

Thanks to the funds of Hakuna Matata, Inuka is able to run a training program for Inuka staff implemented by Stefano Cataldo, an expert in the rehabilitation and health services management field. Running workshops for the staff on such topics as strategic planning has helped immeasurably in the running of the centre.
