Inuka Rehabilitation Centre

The construction of the new orthopaedic clinic has started, with construction work being supervised by Father Tarcisio Moreschi. The clinic is expected to be operational from September this year. It will provide orthopaedic treatments to patients with club foot, fractures and rickets, as well as other disabilities.

However, with the rainy season in full swing, heavy rains are causing delays to the construction, with the transportation of building materials proving particularly challenging. At the same time, everyone is nonetheless grateful for the new life that the plentiful rains will bring.

The foundations and the walls of the new building have been completed. The next stage will be the roofing, which is due to be completed by the end of the month.

Hakuna funds have been used to pay for building materials including bricks, gravel and roof beams - along with labour and supervision costs.

We are excited about this new phase for Inuka and look forward to seeing the continued updates from Tanzania later this year.



Forestry Project - in partnership with Algebris Investments

Since the initial planting in 2019, a dedicated field officer has been appointed in the region to supervise and support the communities involved in the forestry project. This role will be crucial in ensuring the effectiveness of the project and keeping the local people, schools and nurseries both engaged in and aware of the benefits. The first round of monitoring has been carried out by the field officer supervised by Father Tarcisio. We are happy to report that the rainy season so far in Tanzania has been exceptional and thanks to this, the trees are in good shape and growing well.



Pamoja Project

Increasing Inuka IGA (Income Generating Activities) and giving support to vulnerable families is ongoing. All the work is carried out with the support of Wanging'ombe District. Specifically:

- ❖ 7 workers with special needs are employed by Inuka Farm and Hospital, with their salaries covered by Hakuna Matata funds. Their employment helps them to integrate into societal and family life.
- ❖ 50 acres of Inuka fields have been planted ready for the growing season ahead: 7 acres of maize and 43 acres of sunflower.
- ❖ We have purchased 200 chicks to increase farming activities at Inuka Farm, providing food and income.
- ❖ 105 chicks have been donated to over 20 families with disabled children, coupled with training, this can provide a role for these children within the families.
- ❖ Training will be given regularly about good chicken breeding practices to increase their family income and the effectiveness of this new initiative.
